PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT:

President Dave Molnar reported:

- Hainsview Ph 5: Discussion of bond took place. ADR will do a walk through of Phase A & B prior to the dedication and
 release of the bond. A punch list will be created for the developer to complete prior to release of bond. Findings will be
 brought forth to council.
- P & D will develop a systematic way to monitor developers and contractors. This will be provided to council for review.
 Public Meetings will be posted prior to implementation of zoning changes as required by the ORC. The goal is to have a structure in place by 2023.

- Building permits continue to be received.
- Discussion took place with auto sales owner on W. High regarding the vehicles outside of building. Gas Station owner was spoken with regarding removing temporary signs.
- Phone calls regarding the mobile home park have been received. Unsure if the park is up for sale.
- Mayor Collins asked for a follow up on 271 Clearview Dr complaint.

FISCAL OFFICER REPORT:

Gieseler reported:

- All money is accounted for the month of May and the bank statement has been reconciled.
- Monthly bank interest has increased from \$20-30.00/mo to \$355.00 In May.
- Utility Aggregate: Upon energy contract being up for renewal the village has the opportunity to be part of a larger municipal aggregate program through the Ohio Commissioners Association. There are currently 100+ municipalities involved. This would provide best gas and electric rates for the waste water treatment plant and village hall/fire station.
- Intel Task Force meeting was attended May 26th in Pataskala. Two main take-a-ways, build up when improving or implementing infrastructure to prepare for growth. Areas surrounding Chandler Az showed tremendous growth over the last twenty years. The village officials here in Hanover will do everything we can to try to adhere to the residents wishes as it pertains to future growth. The comp plan survey results will identify resident priorities. Molnar will ask Jim Lenner if we can target grants that will subsides the cost of building up and/or inflation.
