- Getting tree replacement recommendations for W. High St. The villages intension is to send tree replacement information out with the project notice letters to residents whose property will be affected.
- Street light outages discussed. New contact received from Energy-Coop.
- Utility Aggregate discussed. Residents are not required to use Palmer Energy. If residents opt out and continue with AEP their electric cost will increase 30%.
- A guardrail was requested for the health and safety of residents on the north side of S. Main Street in front of the Bowerston Shale Co. Complaint received regarding speed of vehicles traveling and property being damaged. Planning will discuss with the village street dept.
